



Create a list of kind acts for kids, such as "hold the door open for someone," "pick up litter," or "compliment a stranger." Then, send your kids

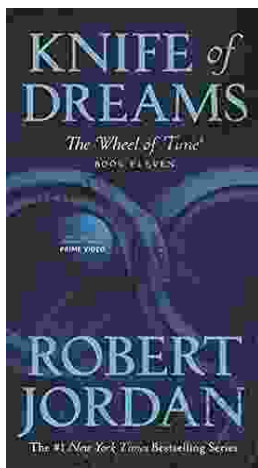

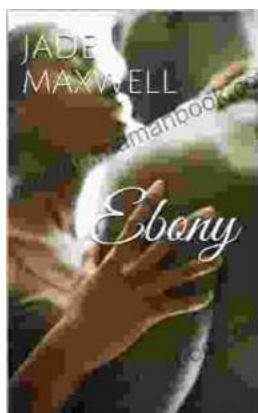
