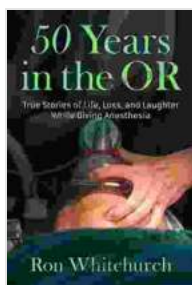


True Stories of Life, Loss, and Laughter While Giving Anesthesia

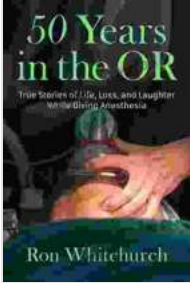

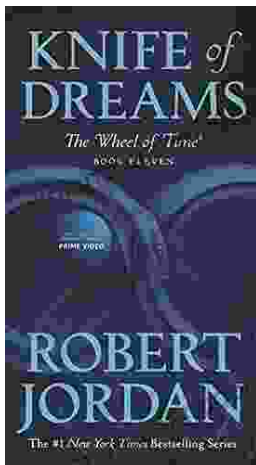

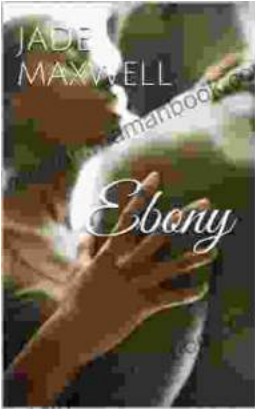
